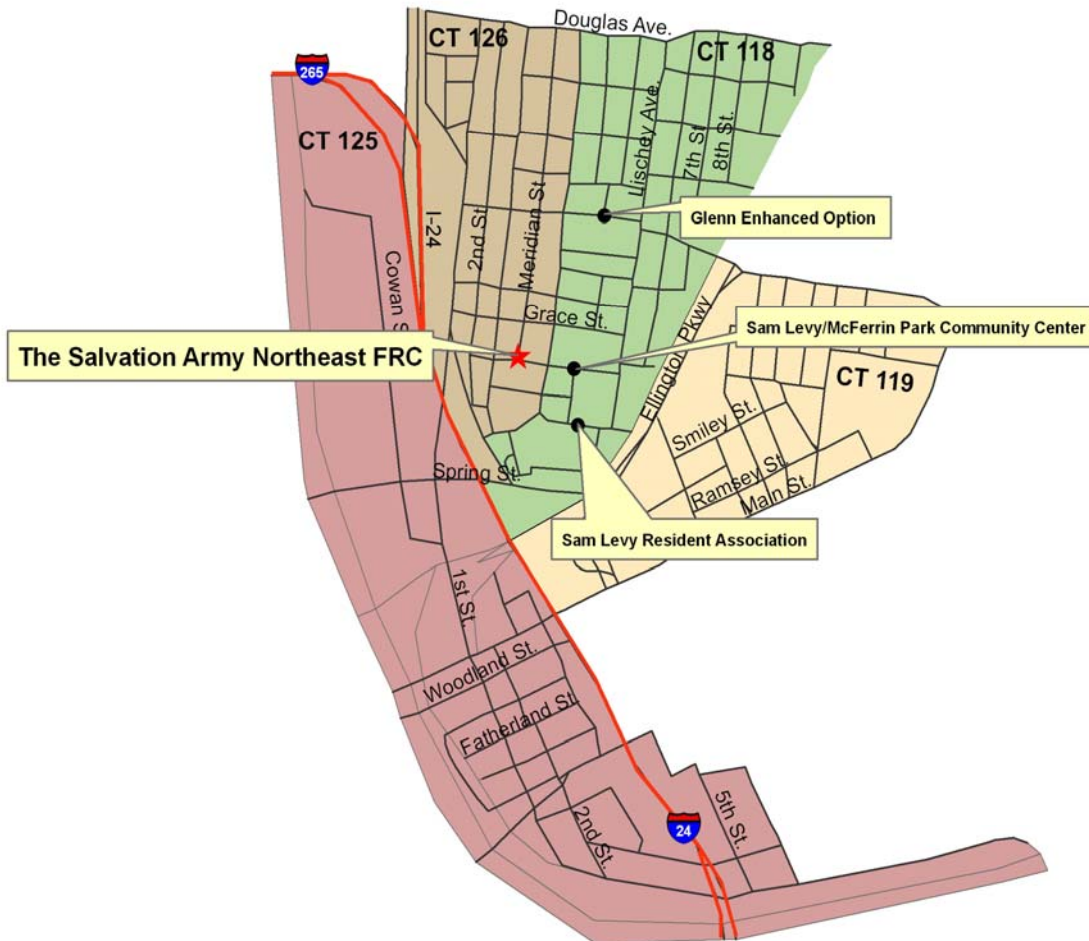

### Measures for Community Goals

**Service Area:** The Salvation Army Northeast Family Resource Center (FRC) is located at 611 Stockell Street at The Salvation Army Red Shield Family Initiative. The FRC service area comprises census tracts 118, 119, part of 125, and 126. The area is bounded by Douglas Avenue, Ellington Parkway, and Interstate I-24, and includes 1<sup>st</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> Streets.

Gra-Mar Middle School is approximately five miles northeast, Jere Baxter Middle School approximately four miles northeast, and Maplewood High School approximately six miles northwest of the FRC. The Salvation Army Northeast FRC service area appears on the map below.

### The Salvation Army Northeast Family Resource Center Service Area



**History:** The Salvation Army Northeast Family Resource Center (FRC) began in 1993 with a SUCCESS BY 6 grant from United Way and an FRC grant from the State of Tennessee. Initially, the Metropolitan Nashville Public Health Department served as the lead agency for the Northeast Nashville FRC that was housed at Caldwell Early Childhood Intervention School.

In early 2001, The Salvation Army Red Shield Family Initiative (RSFI) became the lead agency central host site. In March of 2003, the community was awarded a HOPE VI grant from the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to revitalize the neighborhood. The FRC's top priority has been identified as "Youth are Ready for Productive Adulthood".

**NOTES RELATED TO CRIME DATA:**

Crime reports were provided by Neighborhoods Resource Center using Metropolitan Nashville Police Department 2005, 2006, and 2007 Crime Incident Databases and United States Census Bureau "Census of Population and Housing, 2000 (Tennessee)."

Crime charts for 2005-2008 crimes against persons include Robbery rather than Offense Against the Family category due to extremely low incident rates for the latter. Due to the variation in crime data provided by Metropolitan Nashville Police Department for 2005-2008, trend comparisons are not possible with previous years. Therefore, crime charts for 2002-2005 years that utilized previously "reported" crime data appear in the Appendix for those Family Resource Centers that requested data during these years.

Crime Rate

The crime rate is the number of crimes per thousand persons.

Crime Incidents

Crime incidents refer to events in which a crime took place, a victim reported the crime, and an incident report was filed by a police officer. Multiple incidents may be filed by a single victim.

Restrictions

In 2008, the Metropolitan Nashville Police Department stopped providing public access to crime incident data for open investigations. Therefore, the tables summarize only those crime incidents that have been cleared by arrest, or cases in which prosecution was declined, or the victim refused to cooperate.

**Goal:** Families and Children are Safe

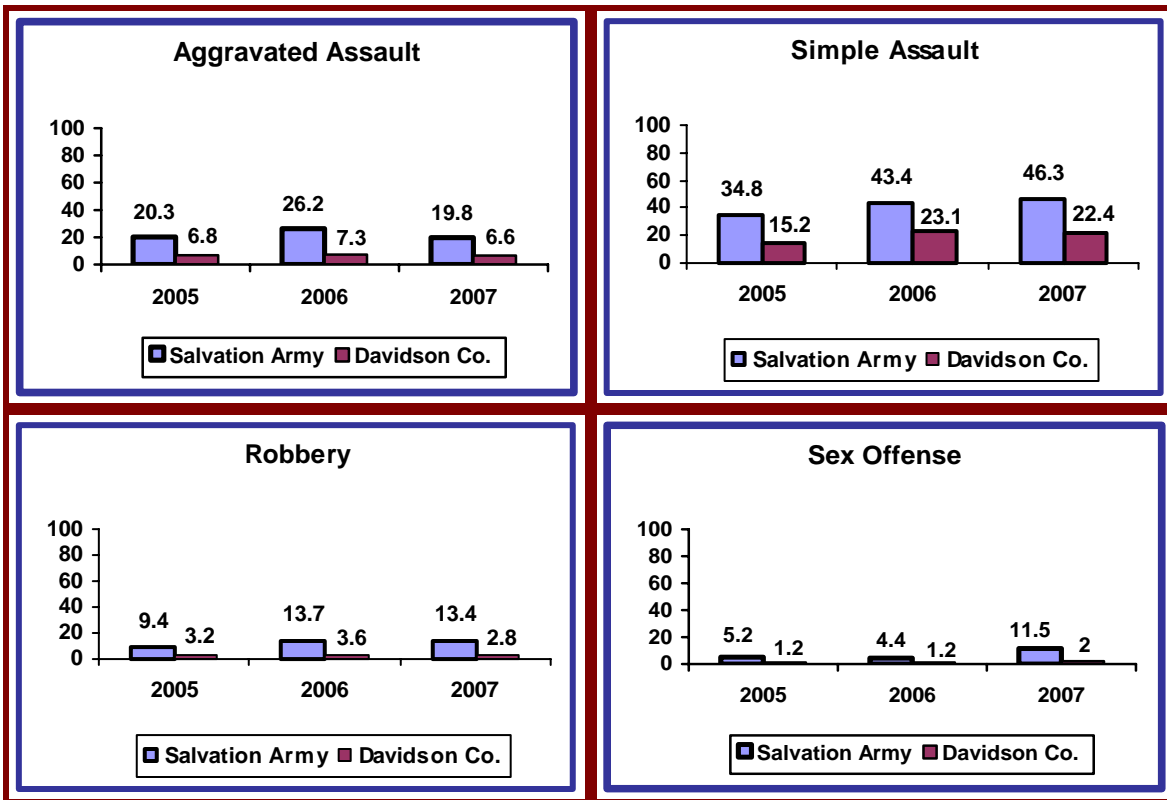
**Measure:** Crime incidents refer to events in which a crime took place, a victim reported the crime, and an incident report was filed by a police officer.

**Description:** Crimes against persons include violence against individuals, such as aggravated and simple assault, robbery, and sex offense.

**What the data show:** From 2006 to 2007 in the Salvation Army area, incidents of aggravated assault and robbery declined while simple assault rose and sex offense incidents more than doubled.

**Measure implications:** Reduction in crime rates is essential to neighborhood safety.

**Goal: Families and Children are Safe**

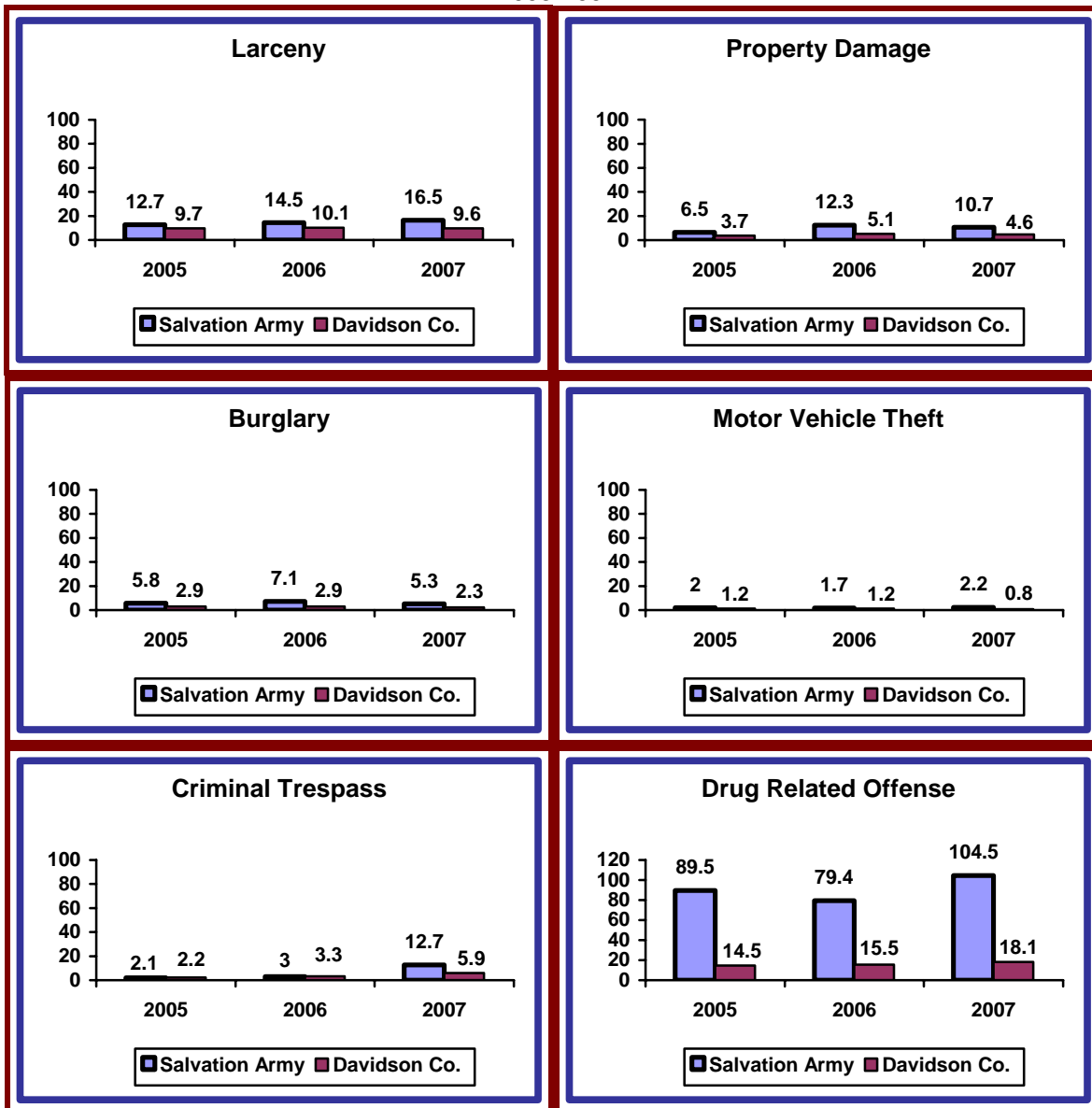
**Measure:** Crime incidents refer to events in which a crime took place, a victim reported the crime, and an incident report was filed by a police officer.

**Description:** Property/other crimes include larceny, property damage/vandalism, burglary, motor vehicle theft, harassment/criminal trespass, and drug related offense.

**What the data show:** Crime incidents in the area for burglary and property damage categories decreased in 2007. Notable increases in crime incidents in 2007 occurred in the criminal trespass and drug related offense categories.

**Measure implications:** Reduction in crime rates is essential to neighborhood safety.

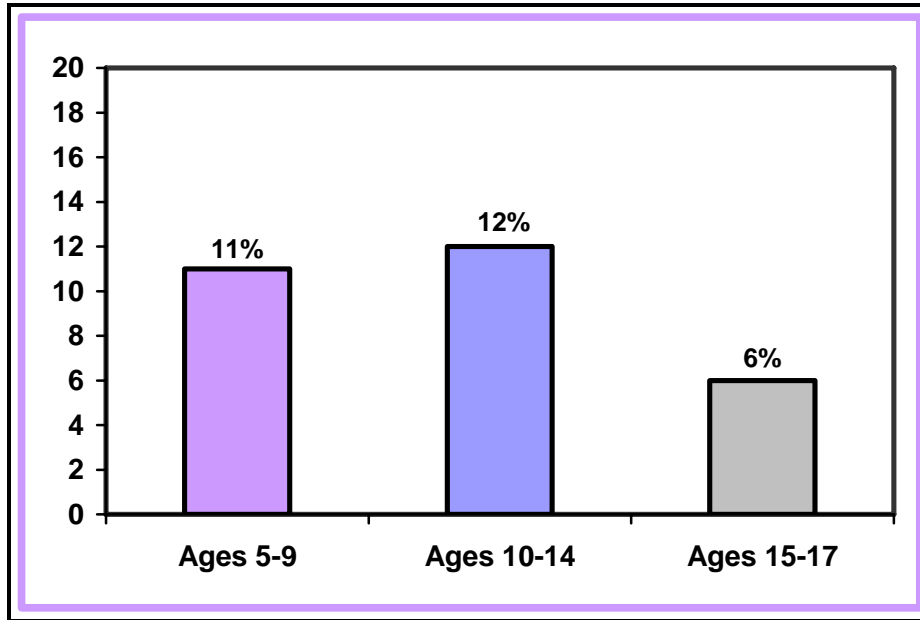
**RATES OF CLOSED CRIME INCIDENTS AGAINST PROPERTY/OTHER IN SALVATION ARMY AREA 2005-2007**

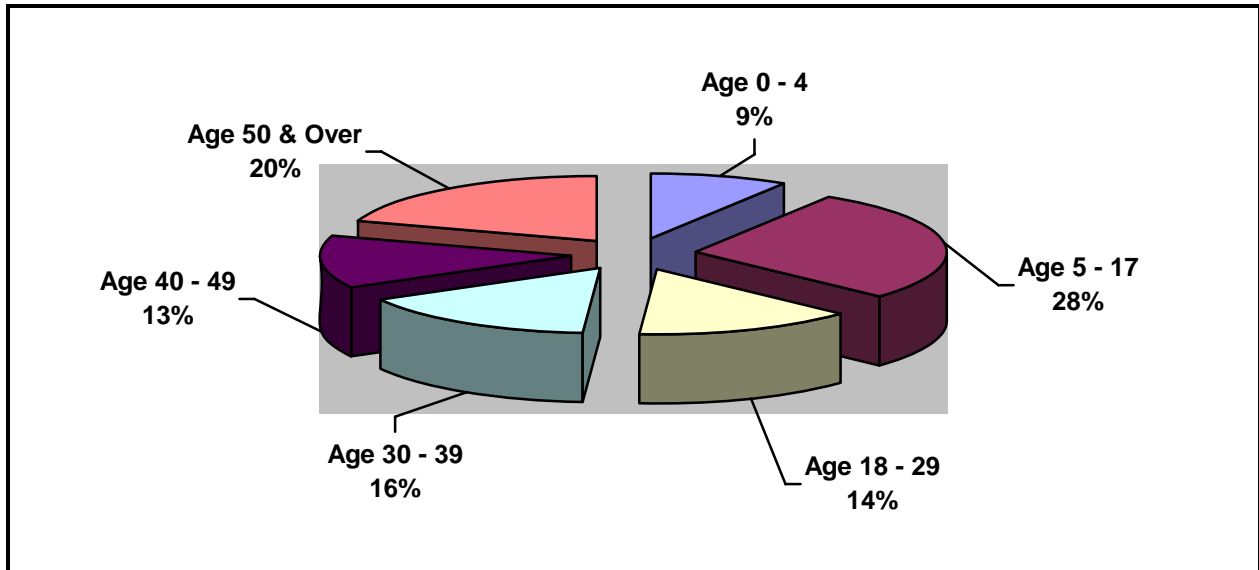

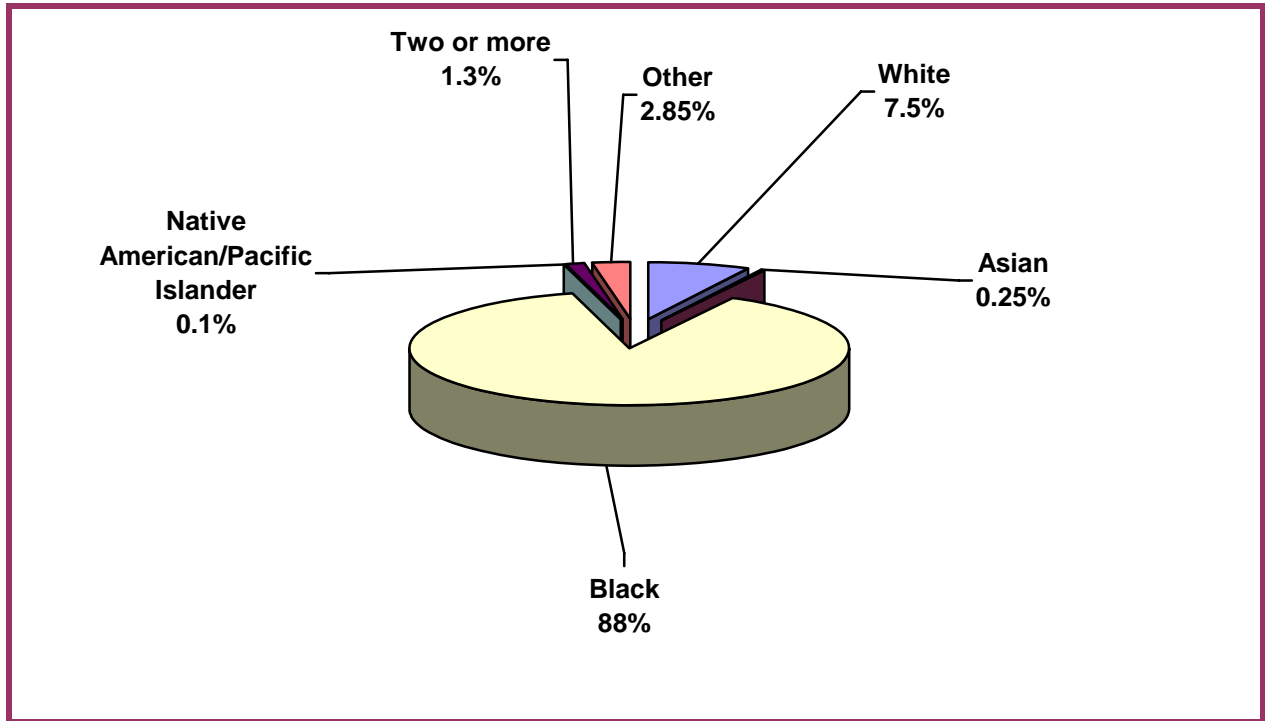

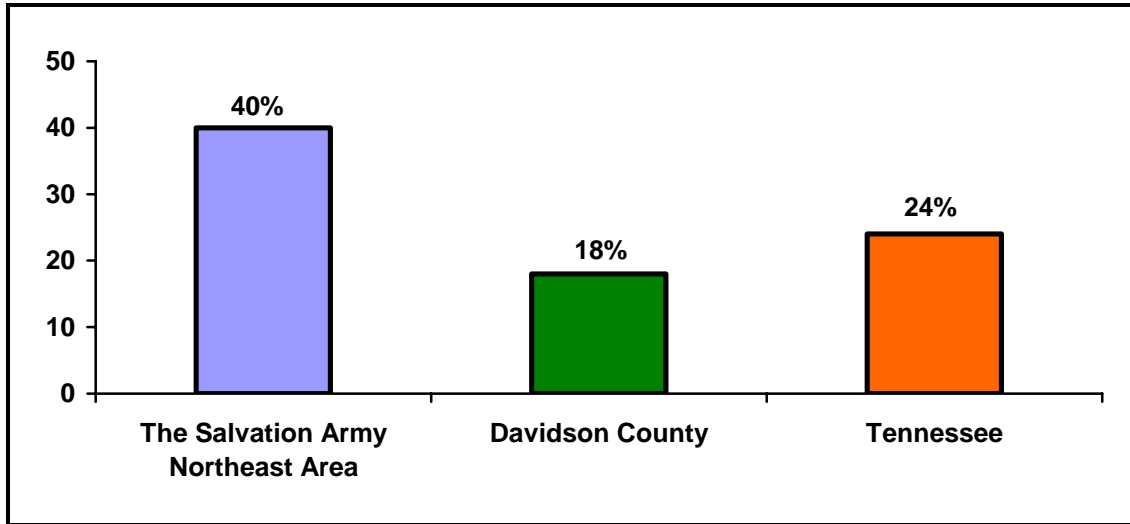

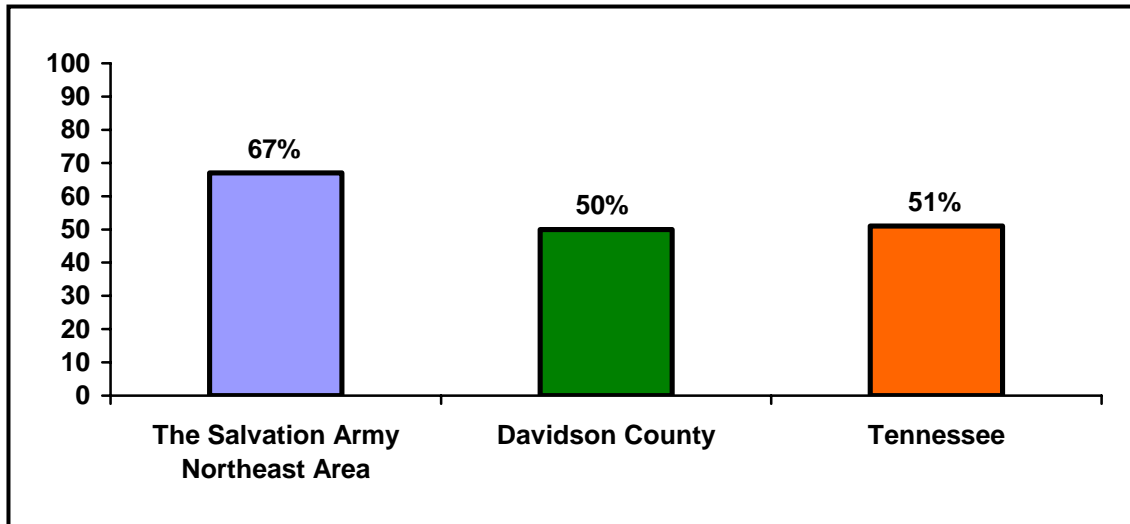

**PERCENT OF POPULATION AGE 25+ WITH LESS THAN A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA OR GED**

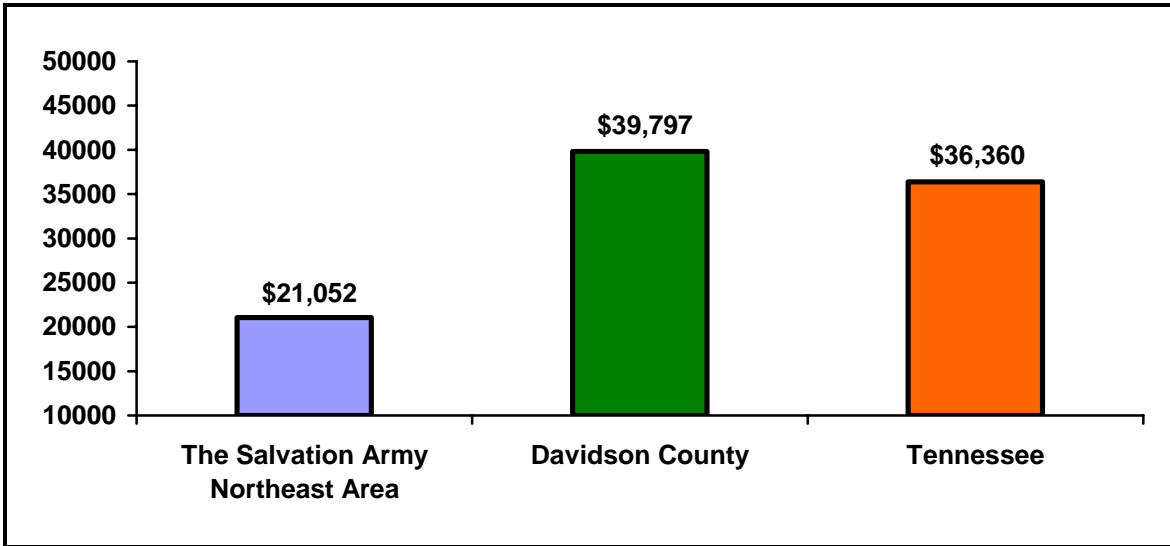

**MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME, 1999**



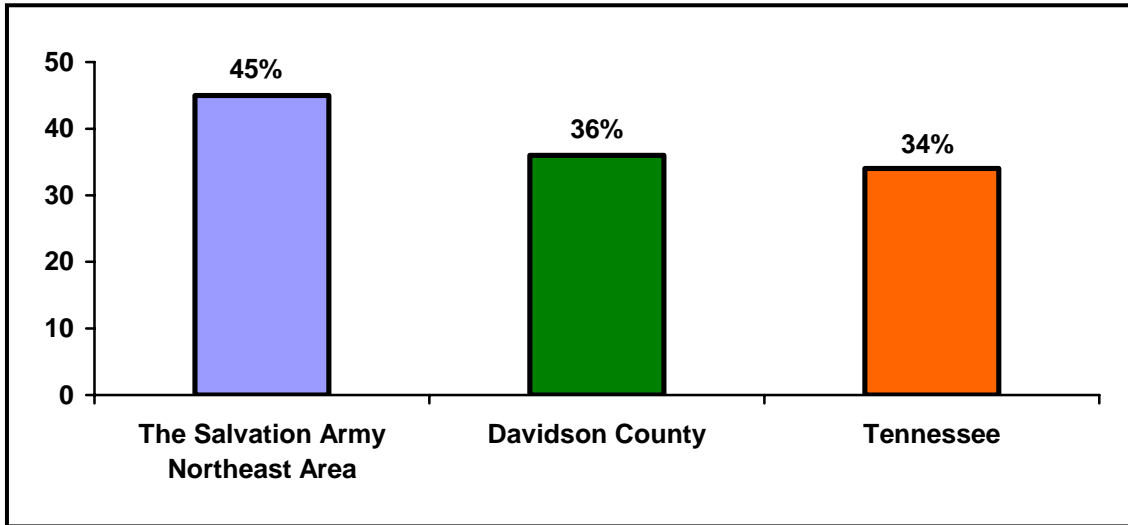

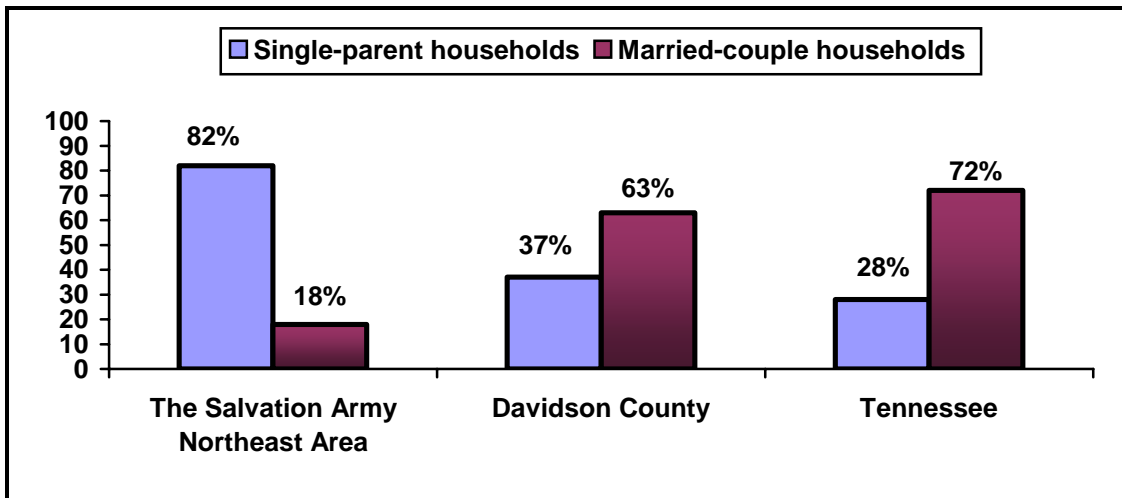
**PERCENT OF FAMILIES WITH RENT BURDEN**

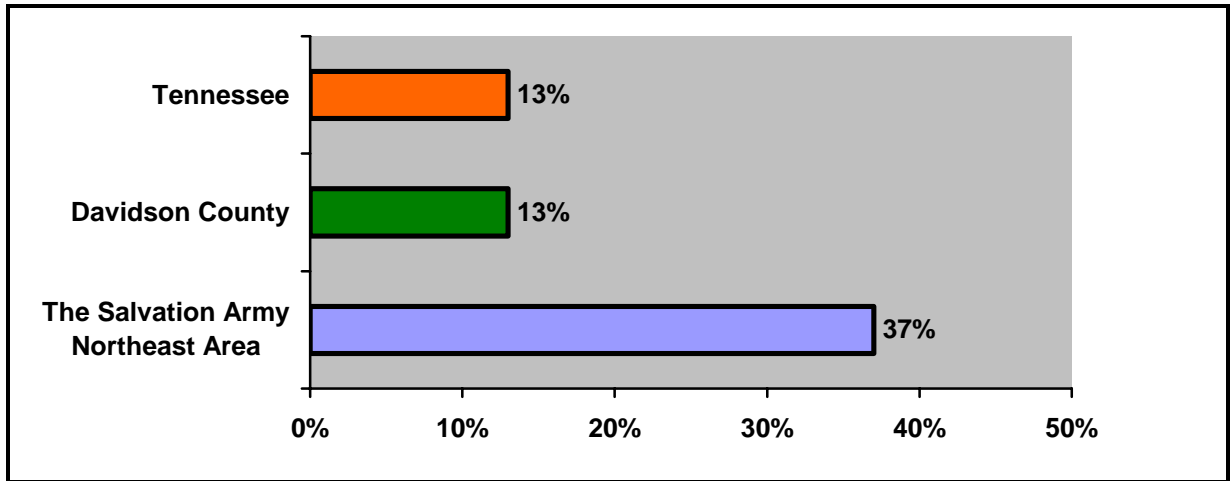
**Notes:** Households that spend more than 30% of their monthly income on rent are considered "rent burdened." Rent-burdened families have less money available for present and future needs.

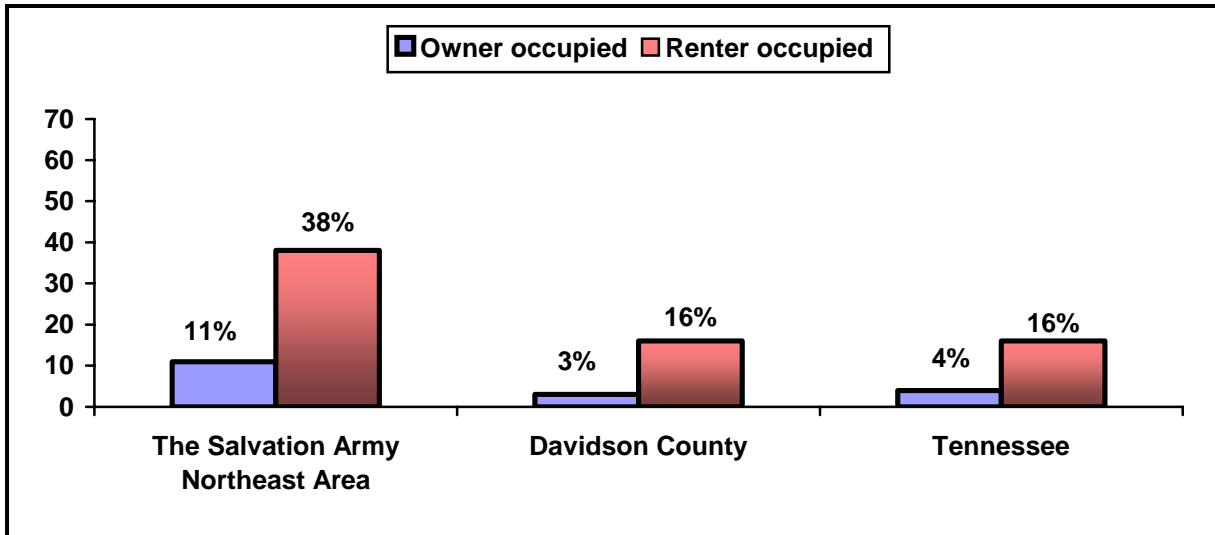
